Scholarship Policies and Guidelines  
Effective January 1, 2013

Eligibility:

1. Dependent children of Local 1121 members in good standing are eligible to apply.
2. Grandchildren of grandparent Local 1121 members in good standing are eligible to apply only if the grandparent member is the legal guardian of the student.
3. Children of Local 1121 members who died within four years prior to July 1, 2013 are eligible to apply. Deceased member must have been in good standing within 90 days of date of death (exceptions to this can only be granted by the scholarship committee).
4. Applicants must be enrolled in a post high school program. Students currently in elementary or high school are not eligible to apply unless the student is a senior in high school and plans to continue their education (as outlined below) after graduating.
5. Courses in accredited technical or specialty schools (such as automotive training, computer training, hair dressing and/or makeup training, etc. can qualify if the program is at least six months in duration, is full-time, and awards a certificate or diploma upon completion.
6. College level programs must consist of at least three courses of three credits each. For college students, a major program of study must be declared by the start of the third year of college.
7. Students must have a "C" average to apply for a scholarship.
8. Students can apply for a scholarship each year throughout their undergraduate years (not to exceed five years). The Scholarship Committee will have the final say as to a particular student's eligibility.
9. Graduate students and students working toward a second bachelor's degree are not eligible.
10. Students who have received five years of scholarship assistance from Local 1121 are not eligible to apply for scholarship assistance for any further training.
11. Members taking an approved course that is not currently offered through the J.A.T.C. Fund are eligible to apply. The course and/or program must be preapproved by the Scholarship Committee.

Application Process:

1. Eligible students seeking scholarship assistance from Local 1121 must complete a basic application each year they apply. Applications must be received by the Local no later than June 1 each year. Applications will not begin to be accepted until February 1<sup>st</sup> each year.
2. A current letter of college acceptance is required if you are a beginning freshman. If you are enrolling in a technical or other non-college level program, a letter of

acceptance into the program is required. In addition, a copy of a paid invoice to the school must accompany each application.

3. The most recent official high school or official college transcript must accompany the application. Photocopies of transcripts are not acceptable. For non-college level programs, a letter from the school administration indicating current satisfactory status is required each year after the first year of attendance.
4. The Scholarship Committee can revise the opening date for applying each year, and also revise the deadline for applying each year.

### Scholarship:

1. The Scholarship Committee may set the annual scholarship amount and the overall total scholarships to be awarded each year, if the amounts differ from those amounts stated below.
2. Unless otherwise voted by the Scholarship Committee, each annual scholarship will not exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000).
3. Unless otherwise voted by the Scholarship Committee, the total of all scholarships awarded each year will not exceed twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000).
4. Each scholarship award will be disbursed directly to the student.
5. Students who decide not to enter a post high school program after being awarded a Local 1121 scholarship will be required to refund the amount of the scholarship to the Local.
6. The scholarship is funded with a five cent per hour deduction from millwright wages.
